



2010 State Legislative Priorities

The failing economy is being felt at every level in our community. We know that revenues are reduced and that need is increased. Our fragile safety net is fraying, and we are asking for leadership in this difficult time. Too many of our neighbors are without adequate services and decent housing and the numbers are increasing. We urge you to protect our most vulnerable neighbors by prioritizing and holding harmless safety net services such as food, clothing and shelter as difficult budget decisions are enacted. In light of the state's current fiscal crisis, we will support balanced and fairly distributed revenue raising measures to maintain or improve programs promoting self-sufficiency for Maryland's neediest citizens. A compassionate and responsible community must choose first to ***Do No Harm***.

Health and Well-Being

- ◆ We support the Maryland Health Care for All! Plan and encourage expanding access to health insurance.
- ◆ Restore funds to the state public mental health system for appropriate mental health services.

Workforce Opportunities

- ◆ Designate stimulus funding to train and employ members of our low income community in green jobs
- ◆ Sustain and expand adult basic education, ESOL, literacy and financial literacy services and provide greater access and funding for employment and job training programs for low-wage workers by designating stimulus funding for our low income community
- ◆ Restore funding for low-income children, including after-school care, day care and gang prevention programs.
- ◆ Allow persons convicted of minor nuisance crimes to apply to have these crimes cleared from their public records to enhance employment opportunities.

Housing & Energy

- ◆ Identify stimulus funding which supports green energy and improves the energy efficiency of affordable housing.
- ◆ Support initiatives to relieve the burden of high costs for utilities for low-income households, and to optimize energy utilization, conservation and affordability
- ◆ Sustain foreclosure prevention initiatives, with a priority of avoiding eviction.
- ◆ Support growth of the Maryland Affordable Housing Trust

Reject Anti-Immigrant Legislation

- ◆ We continue to call on our legislators to **reject legislation that seeks to deny dignity and social justice** to our immigrant community.
