Dear Friend,

Earlier this month, the Montgomery County Council held a hearing on the County's proposed budget for the upcoming fiscal year. I had the privilege of testifying on behalf of the 35,000 people Interfaith Works serves annually about the growing needs our community faces and what we are doing to help.

During the public comment process, many people connected to the IW community also shared their insights and experiences. Employees, volunteers, Board members, and clients provided their thoughts about the challenges facing our neighbors. I am grateful to be part of a community that allows people to share openly their concerns and priorities. One of the Montgomery County residents expressing her truth was Sheena, who participates in the IW Vocational Services Program. She wrote of her experience as a single mom who, after losing her job, was forced to access the County's shelter system. She reflected on how difficult that time was for her family and how much she depended on programs like those provided by IW.
